Essential Job Functions:

The following duties are typical for this position. These are not to be construed as exclusive or all-inclusive. Other duties may be required and assigned.

- Cut, fit, and assemble lumber and plywood, and other materials to be used as concrete forms.
- Set forms for concrete construction; erect scaffolding; or do finishing work.
- Measure accurately and mark precise cutting lines on materials, using ruler, pencil, chalk, and marking gauge.
- Follow established safety rules and regulations and maintain a safe and clean environment.
- Verify trueness of structure, set grade, check for plumb, etc.
- Shape or cut materials to specified measurements, using hand tools, or power tools.
- Read specifications, blueprints, sketches, building plans, and form drawings to prepare project layout and determine dimensions and materials required.
- Erect scaffolding and ladders for assembling structures above ground level.
- Remove damaged or defective parts or sections of structures and repair or replace, using hand tools.
- Select and quantify lumber and other required materials.
- Coordinate with other crew members to perform tasks at hand.
- Fabricate and install concrete reinforcing bars.
- Place and finish concrete.
- Maintain a clean, organized work area.
- Assist with scheduling and coordination of materials, labor and equipment relating to the work area.
- Other duties as required.

Further, this means that you must be ready to work when your shift starts. So, you must arrive at work with enough time prior to ready yourself for the shift. They should also work safely without presenting a direct threat to self or others.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities Required to Perform Essential Functions:

Technical Knowledge:

Ability to perform a variety of duties that may often change and work within standards of accuracy.

Physical Requirements:

Ability to stand or walk for long periods; use arms and hands to reach for, handle and manipulate objects; lift and carry materials weighing up to 60 pounds. Climb up and down ladder, scaffolds and other objects and carry tools and equipment. Stoop, kneel, crouch, and/or crawl. Ability to see well and distinguish between back up alarms, voices and other normal sounds consistent with construction job sites.

Environmental Adaptability:

Work inside and outside in all weather conditions, and various locations. Hard hat, hearing and eye protection required.
